St John's Kirk, Perth

The carillon at St John's Kirk is one of only a few in Scotland and consists of 35 bells cast by Gillett & Johnston. Installed in the 1930s, it is a treasured part of Perth's musical and cultural heritage. The carillon is housed in the historic tower of the city's oldest church, offering a wide dynamic range and tuneful resonance ideally suited for both classical and contemporary repertoire.

Loughborough

Loughborough is home to the War Memorial Carillon, located in Queen's Park. Built in 1923, it is the only purpose-built carillon tower in the UK and houses 47 bells. It is maintained by the Loughborough Carillon Tower and War Memorial Museum. The bells were cast by the local firm John Taylor & Co., one of the world's leading bell foundries.

Falkirk

While Falkirk itself does not currently have a full carillon, it is home to accomplished carillon performers like Tom Moyes and Richard Laing. Scotland's carillon community is closely linked, and Falkirk musicians have contributed widely to performances across the UK, particularly in Perth and Edinburgh.

Bournville

The Bournville Carillon, located at Bournville Village Green near Birmingham, was installed in 1906 by George Cadbury. It consists of 48 bells, making it one of the most complete and impressive carillons in the UK. The carillon plays regularly and forms a centrepiece of musical life in the model village created by the Cadbury family.

Newcastle upon Tyne

Newcastle does not have a full traditional carillon but has several towers with chiming bells. Carillonist Jonathan Bradley, based in Newcastle, performs widely across the UK and composes original works specifically for the instrument. His innovative programming brings modern relevance to a historic art form.

Dundee

Although Dundee does not possess a carillon tower, its bell-ringing tradition remains strong through its churches and universities. Ruth Irons has developed a distinctive repertoire inspired by local melodies, often performed on portable or visiting carillons.

Saltley (Birmingham)

Saltley has historical connections to bell music through Birmingham's wider carillon culture, particularly at Bournville. Michael Boyd, based in Saltley, frequently performs at national venues and brings with him a broad repertoire featuring European composers and British originals, some linked directly to St John's Kirk.
